
Changes in Number of Films Released (2008-2017)

Between 1955 and 2004, the number of films released at theaters has been up and down but roughly 550 to 700 films per year. In 2005, the number jumped to 731, and has mostly kept increasing to 1,187 in 2017. In some years, the number dropped a little, but in 2013, for the first time, the number of films released was over 1,000, with a combination of more than 500 each of Japanese and foreign films. In 2017, nearly 600 Japanese and foreign films each were released.

With digitalization, film production budgets have decreased, more universities and professional schools have begun to teach film, and a public film production support system has been established. These are the factors behind the increase of Japanese films released. The number of foreign films released in 2009 was 314, which increased to 593 in 2017, almost doubling.

The number of screens in 1993 was 1,724, which doubled to 3,531 in 2017. Meanwhile, the theatrical release period of each film has been shortened, as the number of films screened by each theater has been increasing. Outside multi-screen theaters, the programmers have a hard time changing their films so frequently.

Changes in Number of Films Released (2008-2017)





In 2017, the box office income in Japan was
125,483,000,000 yen for Japanese films (decreasing by
23,125,000,000 yen from the year before), 103,089,000,000 yen for
foreign films (increasing by 16,189,000,000 yen from the year before),
and in total, 228,572,000,000 yen, decreasing by
6,936,000,000 yen from the year before.
In 2016, the box office income in Japan was the largest of

this century, thanks to mega hits like YOUR NAME and STAR WARS: THE FORCE AWAKENS. The box office income in 2017 was not as large as that in 2016, however, such foreign series films showed strong results: FANTASTIC BEAST AND WHERE TO FIND THEM, DESPICABLE ME 3, PIRATES OF THE CARIBBEAN: DEAD MENTELL NO TALES, ROGUE ONE: A STAR WAR STORY and RESIDENT EVIL: THE FINAL CHAPTER. Among Japanese films, animated films did well, such as DETECTIVE CONAN: CRIMSON LOVE LETTER, DORAEMON THE MOVIE 2017: GREAT ADVENTURE IN THE ANTARCTIC KACHI KOCHI and POKEMON THE MOVIE: I CHOOSE YOU! As a whole, Japanese films in 2017 did better than they did in 2014 and 2015. In 2016, 42 Japanese films had more than 1 billion yen box office income, far exceeding the 19 such foreign films. In 2017, 38 Japanese films and 24 foreign films each had more than 1 billion yen box office income. The share of Japanese films was 54.9% and that of foreign films was 45.1%, an increase for Japanese films from the year before.

The average attendance per film was 137,557 (decreasing by 4.549 from that of the year before), having remained largely the same since 2014.


Changes in Box Office Income (2008-2017)


Films That Made Less Than 1 Billion Box Office Income

In 2017, 62 films made more than 1 billion yen box office income (61 films in 2016), occupying 5.2% of the 1,187 films released in Japan. The total box office income from these 62 films was: Japanese films made 77.7 billion yen, foreign films made 84.1 billion yen, and in total, 161.8 billion yen, 70.8% of the total box office income of Japan.

62 (5.2%) of the films released in Japan in 2017 made 70.8% of the total box office income of Japan. The other 1,125 films (94.8%) shared the remaining 29.2% (66.7 billion yen). This situation has not changed in the last 10 years. Among Japanese films, about 40 films were released in more than 300 theaters, and about 100 films were released in more than 100 theaters (17% of the total films released in Japan). About 370 films were released in less than 30 theaters, which was more than 60% of all the films released in
